Through Kuala Lumpur, Sabah is connected to New Delhi, Chennai, Mumbai, Kolkata, Hyderabad, Kochi, and Bengaluru in India, which are operated by Batik Air, Malaysia Airlines and AirAsia. Sabah receives over 200 weekly flights from Kuala Lumpur.

Sabah has 4 major airports: Kota Kinabalu International Airport, Sandakan Airport, Tawau Airport and Lahad Datu Airport. Kota Kinabalu also receives international flights from Singapore, Brunei (Bandar Seri Begawan), Indonesia (Jakarta), Philippines (Manila), South Korea (Seoul & Busan), Japan (Tokyo), Hong Kong, Taiwan (Taipei) and China (Beijing, Guangzhou, Shenzhen, Shanghai, Hangzhou & Wuhan).

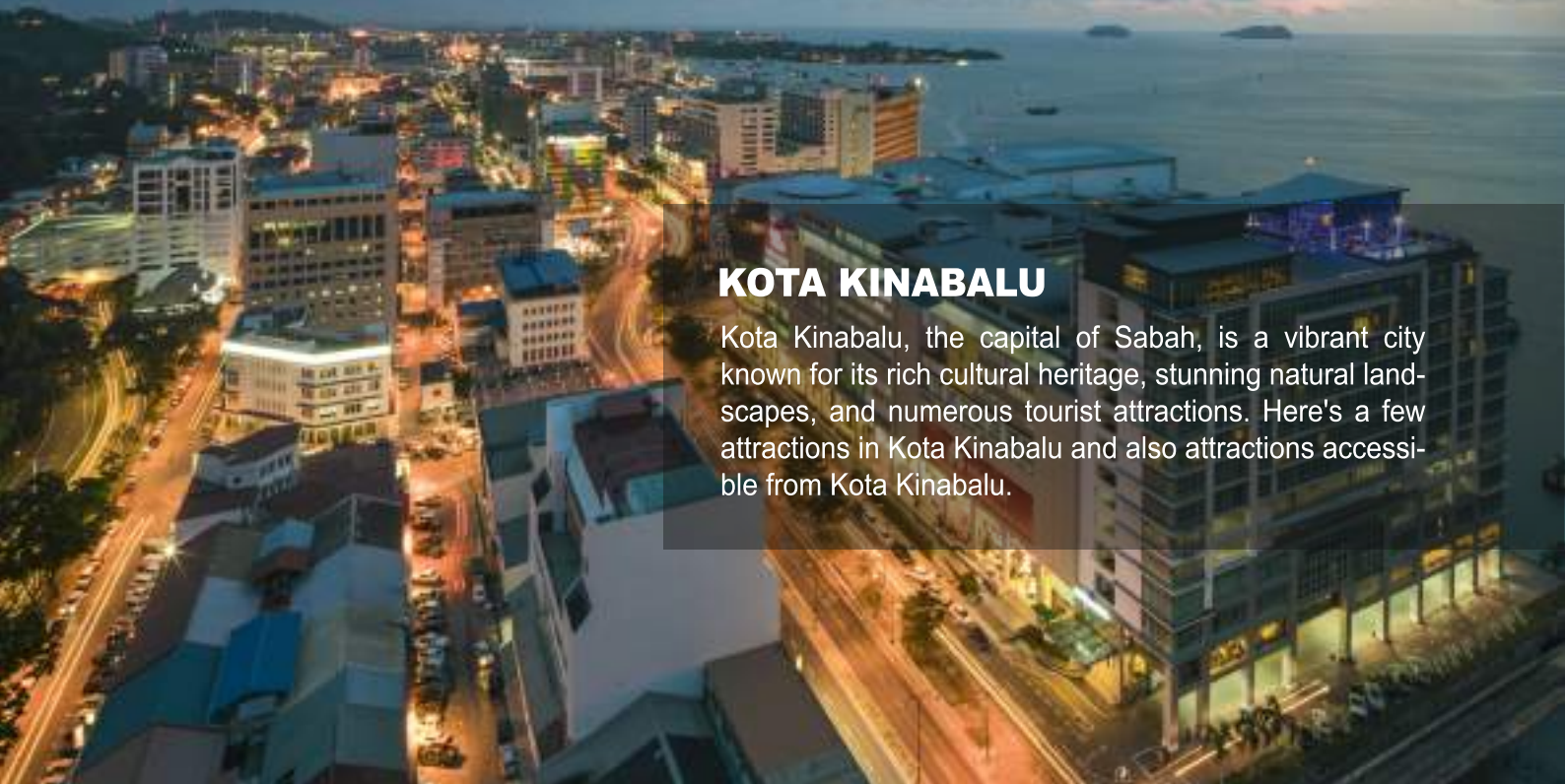

As a part of Malaysia, Sabah, North Borneo is a shining example of authenticity and diversity. KOTA KINABALU

Kota Kinabalu, the capital of Sabah, is a vibrant city known for its rich cultural heritage, stunning natural landscapes, and numerous tourist attractions. Here's a few attractions in Kota Kinabalu and also attractions accessible from Kota Kinabalu.



SABAH TOURISM BOARD BUILDING

SABAH TOURISM BOARD BUILDING

Located at 51 Gaya Street, this building is one of the three buildings still standing after the allied bombing at the end of World War II. Constructed in 1916 (and completed in 1918) to house the Printing Office, and later the Treasury, Audit Office, a bank and the Post Office, this more than a 100-year-old building is currently the office of Sabah Tourism Board (STB) and serves as a Tourist Information Centre.



TUNKU ABDUL RAHMAN PARK

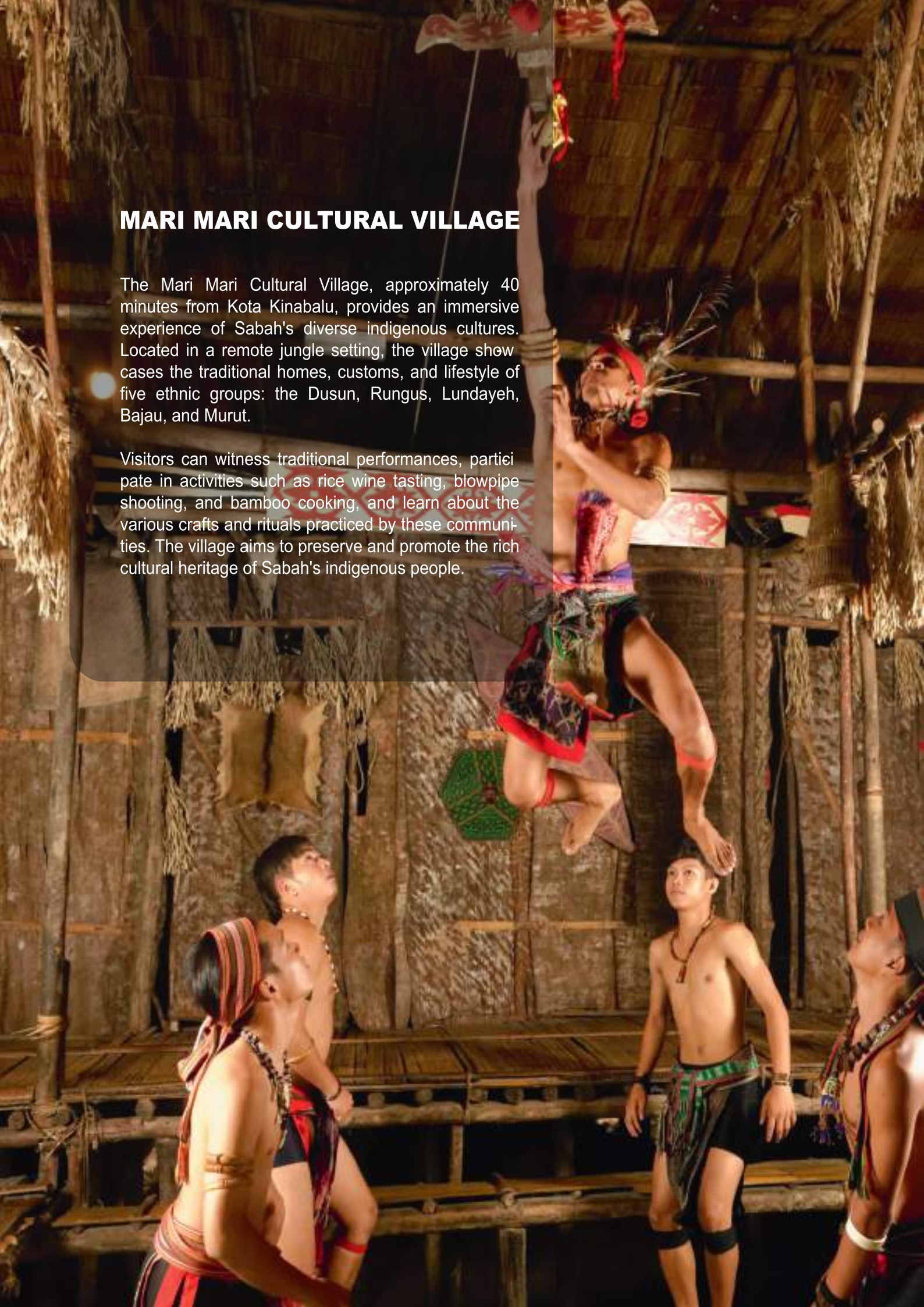
Tunku Abdul Rahman Park is a marine park comprising five islands – Gaya, Manukan, Mamutik, Sapi, and Sulug – located just a short 15 minutes boat ride from Kota Kinabalu. The park is a popular destination for snorkelling, diving, and other water activities.

Each island offers something unique: Gaya Island is the largest with three island resorts offering leisure stays for visitors; Manukan Island is famous for its long, sandy beaches and clear waters ideal for swimming and snorkelling, also has an island resort offering accommodation to visitors; Mamutik Island is the smallest but rich in marine life, offering water activities and accommodation; Sapi Island is known for its lively atmosphere and water sports; and Sulug Island is more remote and no facilities are available on this island.

MARI MARI CULTURAL VILLAGE

The Mari Mari Cultural Village, approximately 40 minutes from Kota Kinabalu, provides an immersive experience of Sabah's diverse indigenous cultures. Located in a remote jungle setting, the village showcases the traditional homes, customs, and lifestyle of five ethnic groups: the Dusun, Rungus, Lundayeh, Bajau, and Murut.

Visitors can witness traditional performances, participate in activities such as rice wine tasting, blowpipe shooting, and bamboo cooking, and learn about the various crafts and rituals practiced by these communities. The village aims to preserve and promote the rich cultural heritage of Sabah's indigenous people.





GAYA STREET SUNDAY MARKET


Every Sunday morning, the whole stretch of Gaya Street is closed off to traffic to make way for the street fair. A must-visit market while in Kota Kinabalu, you will be fascinated by the various items and goods sold at this fair. From arts and crafts, batik sarongs, footwear, fruits and flowers, local snacks and cakes, antiques and souvenirs, to even pets and herbs, this is the best place to experience the culture and lifestyle of Sabahans. KIULU WHITE WATER RAFTING

For adventure enthusiasts, Kiulu River offers an exhilarating white water rafting experience. Located about an hour's drive from Kota Kinabalu, the Kiulu River is classified as Grade I-II, making it suitable for beginners and families. The rafting trip covers about 15 kilometers of scenic river, passing through lush forests and quaint villages.

Participants can enjoy the thrill of navigating rapids while taking in the stunning natural scenery.



MOUNT KINABALU AND KINABALU UNESCO GLOBAL GEOPARK

Kundasang, approximately 2 hours from Kota Kinabalu and located at the foot of Mount Kinabalu, is a picturesque town renowned for its breath-taking views and cool climate.

The Kinabalu UNESCO Global Geopark encompasses the park and surrounding areas including the majestic Mount Kinabalu, highlighting the region's geological diversity. The park is known for its rich biodiversity, housing over 5,000 plant species, 326 bird species, and more than 100 mammal species. Visitors can explore various trails, enjoy bird watching, and take in the stunning views from different vantage points.

Poring Hot Spring, located within the geopark, offers a unique relaxation experience. The hot sulfuric waters are believed to have therapeutic properties, and visitors can soak in the Japanese-style baths or explore the nearby butterfly farm, canopy walkway, and the Kipungit Waterfall.



SUNSET CRUISES / ISLAND CRUISES

North Borneo Cruises

Embark on a cruise to enjoy Sabah's premier sunset with the background of Tunku Abdul Rahman Park islands and the city's popular waterfront while enjoying great food and live music on the North Borneo Cruises (NBC). The sunset dinner cruise starts at 4.30pm and visitors can also opt to go for the KK City Night Cruise on NBC which starts at 7.30pm. These two sessions are operated daily. – Operated by Amazing Borneo.

Seatango

Those looking to spend private quality time with family and friends while enjoying a sunset cruise may do so with Seatango, catering to smaller groups and ideal for a fun and memorable experience with loved ones. – Operated by Amazing Borneo.

Amazing Love

The Amazing Love which offers private charter services is a power yacht equipped with air-conditioned cabins and en-suite bathrooms, saloon seating for dining and entertainment, including a lifting platform for easy access to the waters, a barbeque grill and wet bar at the flybridge and a main deck that provides you with panoramic views. Overnight charters are also available. – Operated by Sutera Sanctuary Lodges.

NIGHTLIFE IN KOTA KINABALU

One of the most popular areas for nightlife in Kota Kinabalu is the Waterfront, a picturesque stretch lined with restaurants, bars, and entertainment venues. Here, locals and tourists alike gather to enjoy stunning views of the sunset while sipping cocktails or sampling delicious seafood. There are also rooftop bars offered by hotels and resorts within the city.

Music enthusiasts will find plenty to love about Kota Kinabalu's nightlife scene, with numerous venues hosting live bands and DJs playing everything from jazz and blues to electronic and pop music. Whether you're in the mood for dancing or simply want to enjoy some great tunes, you'll find no shortage of options to keep you entertained until the early hours of the morning.

In addition to its bars and clubs, Kota Kinabalu is also known for its bustling night markets during the weekends, where visitors can sample local street food and soak up the lively atmosphere. These markets offer a unique opportunity to experience the vibrant culture of Sabah while enjoying some of the region's most delicious culinary delights.

SHOPPING MALLS AND HANDICRAFT SHOPS IN KOTA KINABALU

For keen shoppers, major shopping complexes are open from 10:00 am until 9:00 pm. You may find most shops offer products ranging from local to imported goods. There are also many handicraft shops selling local crafts within these complexes.

Most major shopping complexes in the city are within walking distance or a short car ride from each other including Suria Sabah, Wisma Merdeka, KK Plaza, Centre Point, Wawasan Plaza and Imago Shopping Mall. Visitors may also find duty-free items in shops located at Jesselton Mall, which is East Malaysia's first duty-free mall!

Shopping malls further away from the city center include City Mall, 1Borneo Hypermall, Megalong, and Grand Merdeka Mall.

Visit shopping malls such as Wisma Merdeka Centre Point or the Handicraft Market, near to the Kota Kinabalu Central Market in search of souvenirs to bring back home.

For unique and authentic local Sabah products, swing by to Kadaiku, located at Sinsuran, just across the handicraft market. Kadaiku which in the local dialect means "my shop", offers an extensive collection of authentic, unique, functional and innovative hand made products from the local communities all around Sabah.

SUGGESTED ITINERARY:

KOTA KINABALU – KIULU – KUNDASANG, RANAU

Kota Kinabalu, offers vibrant markets and island adventures. Kiulu, nearby, is famed for its beginner-friendly white water rafting. Kundasang in Ranau, known for its cool climate, boasts stunning Mount Kinabalu views and the serene Kinabalu Park, ideal for nature enthusiasts.

Day 1: Arrival in Kota Kinabalu

- Morning: Arrive in Kota Kinabalu. Check into your hotel and rest.
- Afternoon: Explore the city. Visit the Atkinson Clock Tower and Signal Hill Observatory for a panoramic view of the city.
- Evening: Enjoy a seafood dinner at a seafood restaurant or the night market.

Day 2: Kiulu White Water Rafting

- Morning: Head to Kiulu (about 1.5 hours drive from Kota Kinabalu) for a white water rafting adventure on the Kiulu River. The river is suitable for beginners and families.
- Midday to Afternoon: Enjoy the rafting experience, followed by lunch provided by the tour operator.
- Evening: Return to Kota Kinabalu. Spend the evening at leisure.

Day 3: Transfer to Kinabalu Park

- Morning: Depart early for Kinabalu Park (about 2 hours drive from Kota Kinabalu). Stop by at Pekan Nabalau or Kundasang town to explore and experience the local scene.
- Afternoon: Arrive at Kinabalu Park, register for your climb, and attend a briefing session. Explore the park's botanic garden and leisure trails.
- Evening: Stay overnight at a lodge in Kinabalu Park.

Day 4: Mount Kinabalu Climb (Day 1)

- Morning: Begin your climb to Laban Rata (4-6 hours hike). Enjoy the stunning scenery and biodiversity along the way.
- Afternoon: Arrive at Laban Rata Resthouse.
- Evening: Have an early dinner and sleep early in preparation for the early morning summit climb.

Day 5: Mount Kinabalu Climb (Summit Day) and Return to Kota Kinabalu

- Early Morning: Start the final ascent to the summit of Mount Kinabalu (Low's Peak) to catch the sunrise. The climb takes about 2-4 hours depending on your fitness level.
- Morning: After reaching the summit, enjoy the stunning view of sunrise. Descend back to Laban Rata for breakfast and then continue descending to the park headquarters.
- Afternoon: Return to Kota Kinabalu. Check into your hotel and rest.
- Evening: Enjoy a relaxing dinner in Kota Kinabalu.

Day 6: Relaxation & Leisure at Tunku Abdul Rahman Park

- Morning: Take a boat tour to Tunku Abdul Rahman Marine Park. Stay at one of the island resort. Relax and enjoy the facilities at the resort or on the beach.
- Afternoon: Spend the day with a relaxing massage or spa treatment.
- Evening: Overnight at the island resort.

Day 7: DEPARTURE: Return back to Kota Kinabalu by boat and head to the airport for your flight home or to your next destination.

Tips:

- Packing: Bring appropriate clothing and gear for climbing (warm layers, sturdy hiking boots, headlamp) as well as swimwear, snorkeling gear, sunscreen, and insect repellent.
- Booking: Book your Mount Kinabalu climb permit, accommodation, and tours well in advance, especially during peak seasons.

SANDAKAN

Sandakan, located on the north-eastern coast of Sabah, is a city rich in both nature and historical significance. It serves as a gateway to some of the most remarkable wildlife experiences and conservation efforts in the world. Here are some of the key attractions that make Sandakan a must-visit destination for nature enthusiasts and history buffs alike

SEPILOK ORANGUTAN REHABILITATION CENTRE

Established in 1964, the Sepilok Orangutan Rehabilitation Centre is one of the world's leading orangutan sanctuaries. The centre rescues orphaned orangutans, rehabilitating them to eventually release them back into the wild. Visitors can observe these magnificent creatures in their natural habitat, particularly during feeding times. The centre is dedicated to conservation, education, research, and outreach, playing a crucial role in the preservation of the endangered orangutan population.



BORNEAN SUN BEAR CONSERVATION CENTRE (BSBCC)

Adjacent to the Sepilok Orangutan Rehabilitation Centre, the Bornean Sun Bear Conservation Centre focuses on the world's smallest bear species, the sun bear. The BSBCC aims to rescue, rehabilitate, and release sun bears back into the wild, while also educating the public about their plight. Visitors can learn about the conservation efforts and observe these bears in a naturalistic setting, contributing to the understanding and appreciation of this lesser-known species.

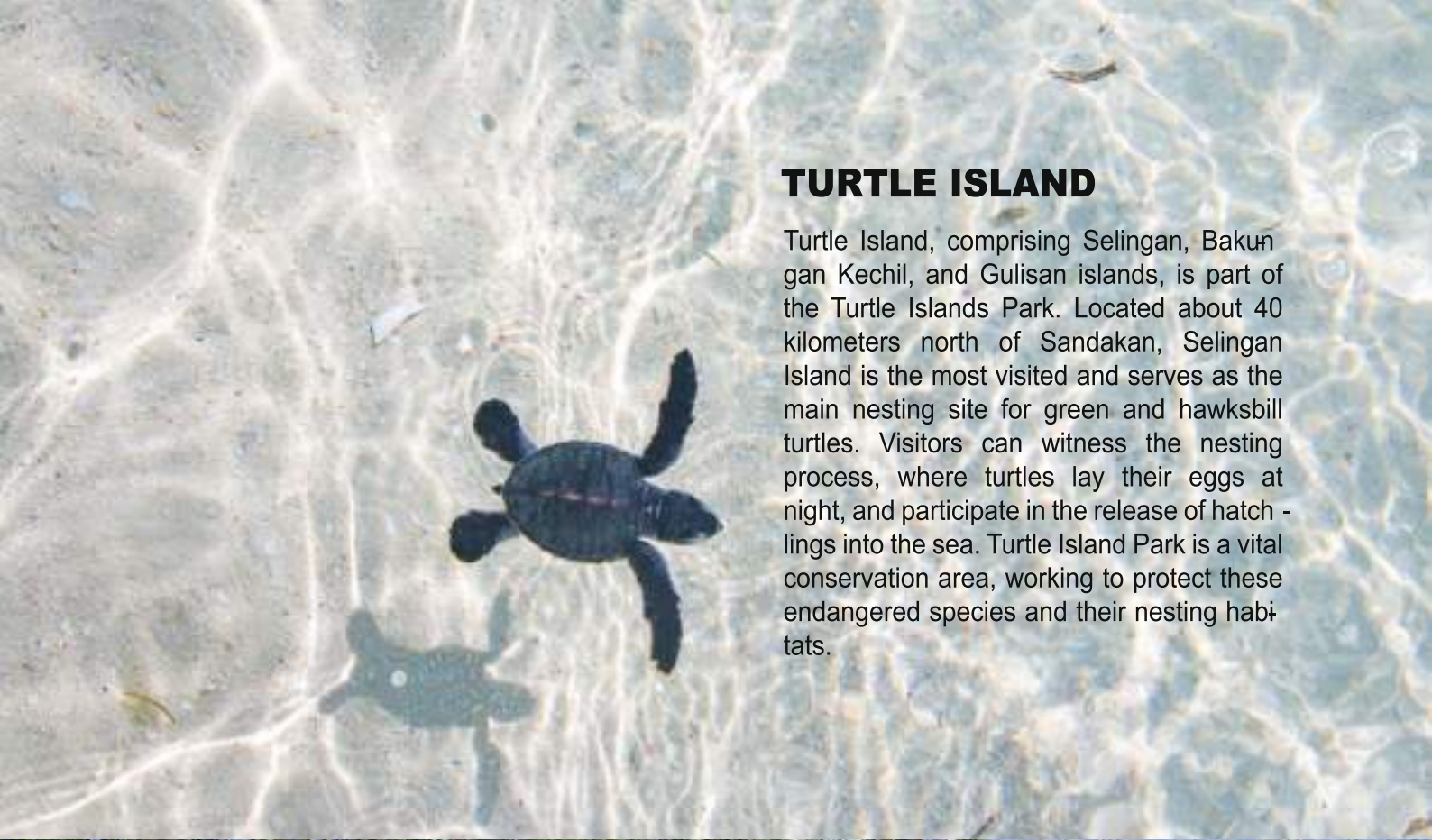
RAINFOREST DISCOVERY CENTRE (RDC)

The Rainforest Discovery Centre, located within the Kabili-Sepilok Forest Reserve, is an environmental education centre that offers a unique insight into the rainforest ecosystem. It features a network of trails and a 620-meter-long canopy walkway called the Rainforest Skywalk. The walkway has 3 viewing towers, providing a bird's-eye view of the forest. The RDC is a haven for bird watchers, with over 250 bird species recorded, and it also hosts educational programs and events aimed at raising awareness about rainforest conservation.



KINABATANGAN RIVER

The Kinabatangan River, Sabah's longest river, stretches over 560 kilometers and is renowned for its incredible biodiversity. The river's floodplain is one of the richest ecosystems in Malaysia, offering a unique wildlife safari experience. Tourists can embark on river cruises to spot a variety of wildlife, including pygmy elephants, proboscis monkeys, crocodiles, and an array of bird species.



TURTLE ISLAND

Turtle Island, comprising Selingan, Bakungan Kechil, and Gulisan islands, is part of the Turtle Islands Park. Located about 40 kilometers north of Sandakan, Selingan Island is the most visited and serves as the main nesting site for green and hawksbill turtles. Visitors can witness the nesting process, where turtles lay their eggs at night, and participate in the release of hatchlings into the sea. Turtle Island Park is a vital conservation area, working to protect these endangered species and their nesting habitats.



SANDAKAN MEMORIAL PARK

The Sandakan Memorial Park is a significant historical site commemorating the fallen Allied soldiers who perished during World War II. It is located on the grounds of the former Sandakan Prisoner of War (POW) camp, where thousands of Australian and British POWs were held by the Japanese. The park features a well-maintained garden with informative plaques. The Memorial Park serves as a poignant reminder of the hardships endured during the Sandakan Death Marches and honours the memory of those who lost their lives. It's a place of reflection and learning, providing visitors with an important historical context to their visit to Sandakan.

SUGGESTED ITINERARY:

Day 1: Arrival and City Exploration

• Morning: Arrival in Sandakan. Check into your hotel and freshen up. Start your exploration with a walking Sandakan Heritage tour to the city's historical sites. Visit:

- o Masjid Jamik
- o Agnes Keith House
- o St. Michael's and All Angels Church
- o Sam Sing Kung Temple

• Afternoon: Lunch at a local restaurant to try some local dishes such as the Seafood Bak Kut Teh. Explore the bustling central market, where you can find fresh produce, seafood, and local crafts.

• Evening: Dinner at a waterfront restaurant. Enjoy seafood with a view of the Sandakan waterfront. Rest up for the adventure-filled days ahead.

Day 2: Wildlife and Nature

• Morning: Visit Sepilok Orangutan Rehabilitation Centre: Spend the morning observing these magnificent creatures. Feeding time in the morning is at 10:00AM. There is also an afternoon session at 3:00PM. Proceed to Bornean Sun Bear Conservation Centre. Learn about the world's smallest bear species and conservation efforts.

• Afternoon: Lunch at Sepilok Nature Resort. Enjoy a meal surrounded by lush greenery. Then proceed to Rainforest Discovery Centre to explore the canopy walk - ways and trails.

• Evening: Dinner at a local restaurant and sample more of the local cuisine. Don't forget to look for UFO tarts for desserts. Head back to your hotel to rest and prepare for the next day's activities.

Day 3: Kinabatangan River Cruise

• Morning: Early departure for the Kinabatangan River area. Check into a riverside lodge. Settle in and freshen up.

• Afternoon: Afternoon cruise to spot wildlife such as proboscis monkeys, crocodiles, various bird species, and if you are lucky, you might get to see pygmy elephants.

• Evening: Enjoy a meal at the lodge. Go for a jungle walk to spot nocturnal animals. Return to lodge to rest and experience the sounds of the jungle as you sleep.

Day 4: Turtle Island Park

• Morning: Early check out from the lodge and departure by boat or by land back to Sandakan and proceed to the Sabah Parks jetty for boat transfer to Turtle Island Park. Check-in at the park accommodation. Settle in and prepare for island activities.

• Afternoon: Snorkeling and Beach Time. Enjoy the crystal-clear waters and marine life.

• Evening: Dinner at the park's dining area. Enjoy a meal with fellow travellers. Witness the incredible sight of sea turtles coming ashore to lay their eggs. And also the releasing of baby turtles.

Day 5: Return to Sandakan and Transfer to Lankayan Island

• Morning: Return to Sandakan by boat.

• Late Morning: Take a boat transfer to Lankayan Island (approximately 1.5 hours).

• Afternoon: Check into your resort on Lankayan Island and enjoy leisure activities such as snorkelling, diving, or just relaxing on the beach.

• Evening: Relax and enjoy dinner at the resort.

Day 6: Lankayan Island Leisure

• Full Day: Spend the day enjoying Lankayan Island. You can go diving, snorkelling, or simply relax on the pristine beaches.

• Overnight: Stay at the resort on Lankayan Island.

Day 7: Return to Sandakan and Departure

Return to Sandakan by boat and head to the airport for your flight home or to your next destination.

Tips:

- Local Customs: Be respectful of local customs and dress modestly, especially when visiting religious sites.
- Packing: Be prepared for hot and humid conditions, and occasional rain. Carry water, sunscreen, raincoat/umbrella and insect repellent.

TAWAU

Known for its strategic position and rich natural resources, Tawau is more than just a transit point; it is a destination brimming with cultural diversity, historical significance, and natural beauty.



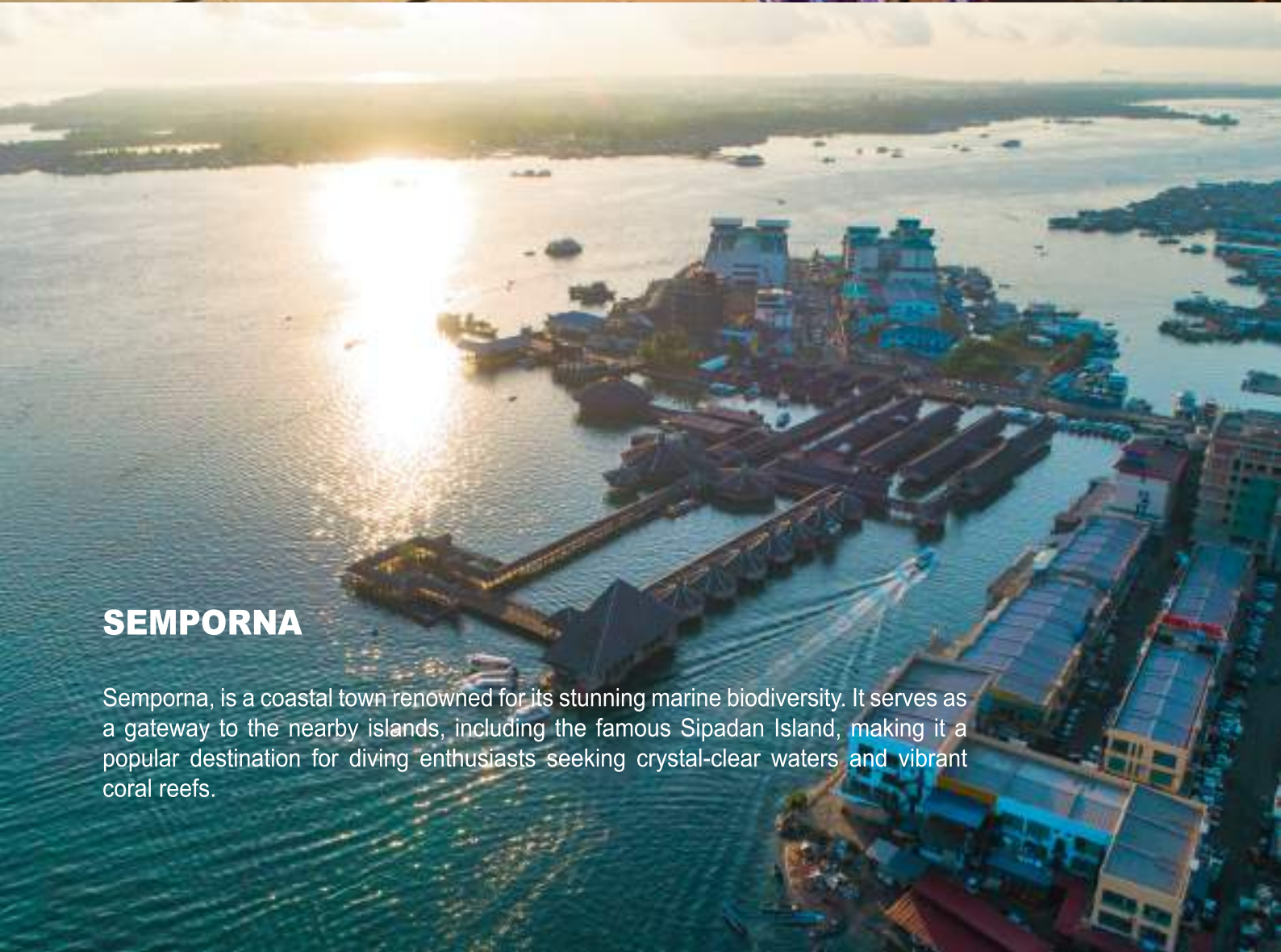
TAWAU HILLS PARK

A prominent attraction in Tawau is the Tawau Hills Park, a sprawling natural reserve offering a lush escape into the wild. Covering an area of approximately 28,000 hectares, the park is a haven for nature lovers and adventure seekers. It boasts a diverse range of flora and fauna, including several species of orchids, rare ferns, and tropical hardwoods. Visitors can explore the park's numerous trails that lead to stunning waterfalls, such as the Table Waterfall and the more secluded Gelas Waterfall. The park's highest peak, Mount Magdalena, stands at 1,310 meters, providing a challenging trek for avid hikers.



TECK GUAN COCOA MUSEUM

A must-visit for chocolate lovers is the Teck Guan Cocoa Museum. Tawau is known for its cocoa industry and the museum proudly houses the history of its development over the years. Get to know the production processes of a chocolate from bean to bar.



SEMPORNA

Semporna, is a coastal town renowned for its stunning marine biodiversity. It serves as a gateway to the nearby islands, including the famous Sipadan Island, making it a popular destination for diving enthusiasts seeking crystal-clear waters and vibrant coral reefs.



MABUL ISLAND

Mabul Island, with its crystal-clear waters and pristine sandy beaches, is a popular destination for divers and snorkelers. 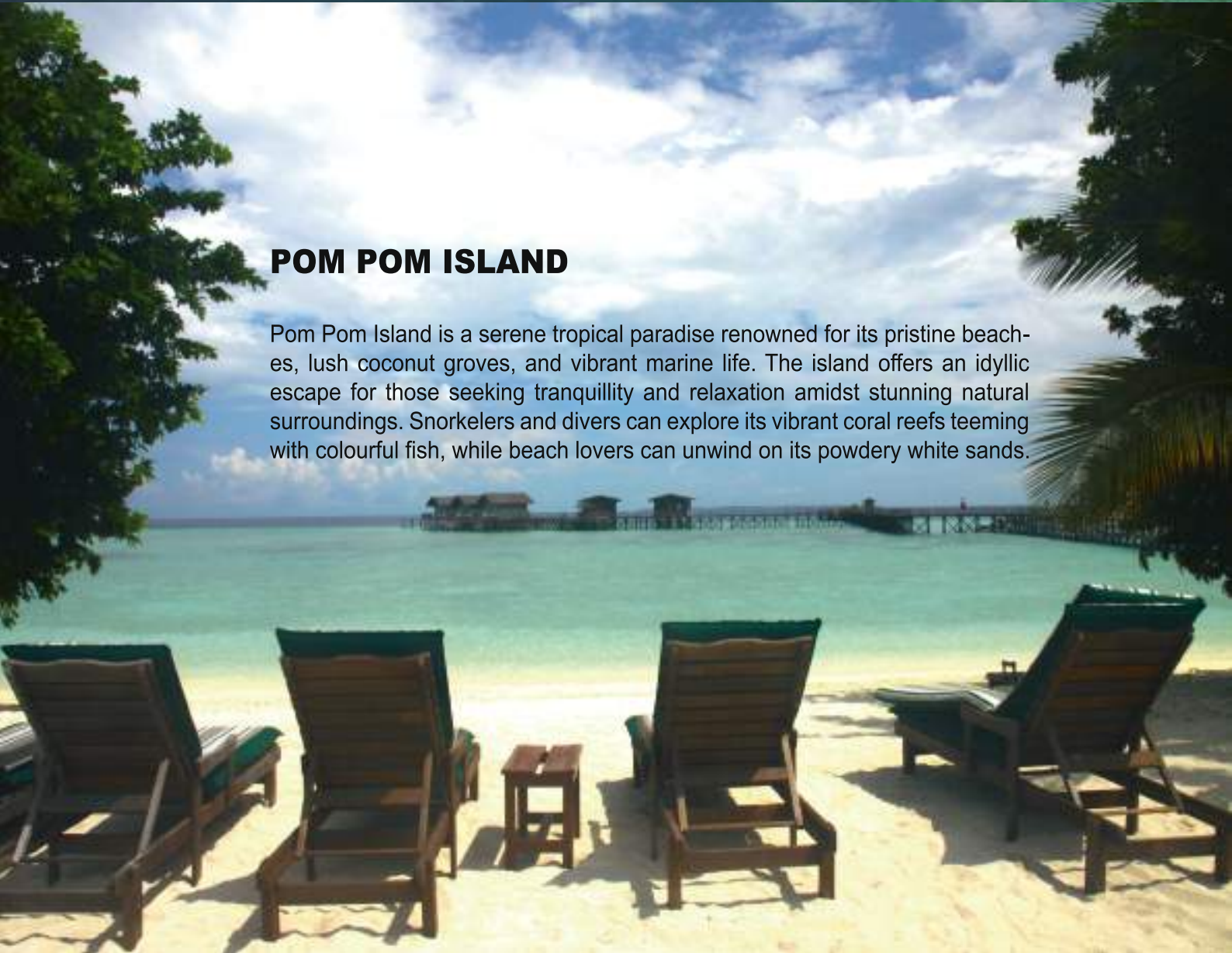

SICC pays homage to the pride of Sabahan, Mount Kinabalu, with the mountain's jagged peak and slate features on the columns and marble floor. The play of the different shades of polished granite draws its inspirations from the various depth and body of the geological formation formed over 10 million of years.

Sabah is the proud home to the rare and exotic, most expensive orchids in the world – Rothschild's Slipper Orchid, which are seen on the ceiling of the lobby. Locally known as Sumazau Orchid, the long sweeping side petals of the flower resembles the outspread arms of the Sumazau dancer, a popular traditional dance of Sabah.

As this orchid is also nicknamed as the Gold of Kinabalu, the ceiling when illuminated emits a "gold" outline of the elegant orchid.

Transitioning to Level 4, the pre-function foyer pays homage to the tranquil cruises along the Kinabatangan River, evoking the atmosphere of the surrounding nipa palm swamp with its inspired carpet design.

As you enter the Convention Hall, be transported to the vibrant marine world. The carpet, alive with hues mirroring the sea's depths, stretches towards floor-to-ceiling windows, framing breathtaking views of the ocean and Gaya Island. Above, the ceiling's abstracts mimic gentle waves, while the walls capture the warmth of sandy beaches.

Adding a touch of local culture, the acoustic walls feature geometric patterns inspired by the Rungus rhythmic weave, known as "Mangavol". This intricate motif, reflecting the region's rich flora and fauna, showcases the craftsmanship of the indigenous tribe.

Lihing Nilyn

A. History and Background

Lihing Nilyn is a traditional home made rice wine, which originated from Penampang. The founder of Lihing Nilyn, Mdm. Honilin Pudin, was born in 1st March 1948, and has been making Lihing for the past 49 years, ever since she was 15 years old. The traditional method of making Lihing Nilyn was inherited from her grandparents for centuries that were pass from one generation to the next. The rice wine were well kept in a ceramic jar (Bunduun in Kadazan) for months and only served to their guest during special occasion such as harvest festival and wedding ceremony. The longer the rice wine is kept, the better and stronger taste it become.

Rice wine is not only served as an alcohol beverage but also to add zest to the food, such as Lihing Chicken, which is normally served to women during her 1-month confinement period after giving birth. Lihing Nilyn is best served cold or mix with two cube of ice to get the maximum taste. It is also best served as cocktail in any function.

The distinctive flavour of Lihing Nilyn is a result of using traditional techniques and ingredient passed down from one generation to the next. This family made rice wine can be enjoyed as beverage or to add zest to savoury dish. It is a must-serve during festive occasion such as Weddings and Harvest Festival.
